A Word From Your Pastor

Greetings Everyone,

I pray that this newsletter finds you well and walking with the Lord Jesus Christ. As I am writing this, I am two days returned from the Ligonier National Conference in Orlando. I want to say that I had a marvelous time just worshipping and being preached to for three straight days! I was also able to visit a church on the Sunday morning and worship with believers there—which is always an enjoyable experience. I am reminded every time I go to a conference or to a church on vacation that the Lord Jesus has people who worship Him everywhere every Sunday! As you know Easter is right around the corner and I do pray that you will join us for our Good Friday service, our Sun Rise service and our worship service (all of the times are in the calendar). We desperately need to be reminded of our living hope through a living Savior, with all of the chaos of these past couple of years!

With that in mind I want to remind you of some of the glorious truths that were proven to be fact when Jesus victoriously, by the power of God, walked out of that tomb. It means that our labor is not in vain, it means that we are not in our sins, it means that our suffering is not in vain, it means that we will see our loved ones again, it means that we can hope in Christ for our future, it means that everything the Bible says is true, it means that everything Jesus said is true, it means that He is Lord of all, it means that He conquered sin and death, it means that He is the Son of God, it means that God has accepted the sacrifice on our behalf, it means that He truly is the long-awaited Messiah, it means that there truly is life after death, it means that there truly is another reality that we cannot see with our physical eyes, and it means that for those who repent and believe in Him for salvation we too will be raised bodily from the grave!

When I think about all of these realities (of course this list is not exhaustive) I am reminded of two passages of Scripture immediately. The first is "For I consider that the sufferings of the present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us" (Rom 8:18 ESV). Paul says this in connection with the (full and final) setting free of the entire creation from the curse of the fall of Adam, which he says will be at "the redemption of our bodies" (Rom 8:23). The second is "For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin" (Rom. 6:5-6). Not only will we be raised bodily from the dead just as Christ was, but because of our union with a resurrected Christ now we are empowered to live as those "alive to God" (6:11) and "set free from slavery to sin (6:12-14, 17). In other words, because of the resurrection of Christ we have a living hope now in Christ and we have a living hope for the future in Christ! What a glorious thing it is to be in God's grace!
